

PREMIER MAGASHULE PROVIDES HOMES FOR MILITARY VETERANS

The unwaveringly hands-on and caring Premier Magashule, in his preparation for the tabling of the State of the Province Address, visited several places in line with his commitments to the 5 key priority areas of government; and to make sure that all was well.

One of the projects he visited is the Military Veterans' houses in Bloemfontein's Bochabela and Batho residential areas. Here, 11 military veteran houses are being built and are currently at various stages of completion. The 60m² houses are built of sandstone, tiled, have ceiling, are commendably stylish designed and stand out as houses fit for those who dedicated their lives for the liberation of the country; the fruit of which we all now savour.

On the eve of the delivery of the State of the Province Address, the Premier awarded a house to the elated Mr Ralegae Kitsa, a military veteran, as a symbol of appreciation and acknowledgement for the sacrifices that was made for all of us.

In handing over the houses, Premier Magashule, mentioned that there will be more houses built for all qualifying military veterans.
